ORDINANCE NO. 1435

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 950 REGULATING THE ISSUANCE OF BUILDING PERMITS AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF HOOD RIVER ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>: That Section 2 of Ordinance No. 950 be amended to read as follows:

"Section 2: In the future, except as hereinafter stated, no building permit will be authorized for the erection of a building within the City of Hood River, unless:

- (1) The tract of land upon which the building is to be located is within the boundaries of the subdivision plat theretofore approved by the Council or tentatively approved by it, and
- (2) The tract of land upon which the building is to be located has satisfactory access to a public street dedicated and accepted as set out on an approved subdivision plat, and
- (3) The tract of land upon which the building is to be erected is located on a street that has been improved to city standards by the placing of curbs, gutters, storm sewers, and paving with an all-weather hard-surface to City standards for the street classification on which it is located."

Section 2: That there is added to Section 3 of Ordinance No. 950 and to become a part of Ordinance No. 950 a subsection 5 to read:

"(5) That the owner of the tract of land for which the building permit is requested will in writing bind himself, his successors in interest to the land, and the land itself, at the request of City, to join in a petition for the improvement of such street to city standards as required by Subsection (3) of Section 2 of

this ordinance as amended, appoint the Mayor as his attorney-in-fact to join in such petition and waive the right to file written remonstrance with the Council upon any hearing for proposed improvement of the street fronting on said tract of land.

Section 2: Inasmuch as there is an urgent need prohibiting the construction of buildings, except on an improved street or street for which improvement is made available, it is the judgment of the Council that this measure is necessary for the preservation, public peace, health and safety of the City of Hood River and its inhabitants, therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance shall go into immediate effect upon its final passage and approval by the Mayor.

Read for the first time: September 8, 1978. Read for the second time: September 12, 1978.
