ORDINANCE NO. 1466

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1280  
TO ALLOW A POLICE OFFICER TO IMPOUND A  
VEHICLE PARKED IN A PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY  
IF THE VEHICLE HAS FOUR OR MORE UNPAID  
PARKING VIOLATIONS.

THE CITY OF HOOD RIVER ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 1280, commonly known as  
the "City of Hood River Uniform Traffic Ordinance", Article XIII,  
Section 68., (5) is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 68. Impoundment of Vehicles.

(5) Whenever a police officer observes a  
vehicle parked in a public right of way within  
the City of Hood River, if the vehicle at  
that time has four or more unpaid parking  
violations outstanding against it, the officer  
may cause the vehicle to be impounded. A  
vehicle so impounded shall not be released until  
all outstanding fines and charges have been paid.  
Vehicles impounded under authority of this  
subsection shall be disposed of in the same  
manner as provided in subsection (2) of this  
section."

Section 2. The remainder of all articles, sections,  
and subsections of Ordinance No. 1280, unless herein expressly  
amended or repealed, shall remain in full force and effect.
