

ORDINANCE NO. 9.

An Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Providing for the Appointment and Duties of Superintendent of Streets"

Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the Town of Hood River:

Section 1. A superintendent of streets may be appointed by the council at any regular meeting, who shall hold his office at the will of the council, or until his successor is appointed and qualified. Before entering upon ~~his~~ the duties of his office, the superintendent of streets shall take and subscribe to the oath of office, and shall execute an undertaking in the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, with sufficient sureties, to be approved by the council, conditioned upon the faithful performance of his duties as such officer, and that he will account for and pay over all moneys that may come into his hands as such officer.

Section 2. The compensation of the superintendent of streets shall be two dollars per day for actual service rendered.

Section 3. The superintendent of streets shall have general charge and supervision of all public streets, roads, sidewalks, bridges, sewers, drains and public grounds within the corporate limits of Hood River, but subject to the jurisdiction of the County Court thereover, and it shall be his duty to keep himself informed of the condition thereof. He shall have supervision of all work for the construction, improvement and repair thereof, done by authority of the council, and shall see that the provisions of all laws, ordinances and regulations relating thereto are strictly enforced, and shall make complaints before the recorder of all violations of ordinances relating to public work and streets and other public property.

Section 4. All work done by or under the superintendent of streets shall be under the direction and control of the council, who shall, from time to time, by resolution, designate the particular work to be done by, and the number of persons or teams to be employed by the superintendent of streets and for what time and purpose, and what materials or tools when necessary, are to be purchased by him. All persons employed by him shall work ten hours a day, and shall be paid at the rate of one dollar and fifty cents per day for each and every day so employed; a man with team shall be paid at the rate of three dollars and fifty cents per day. When any person or persons shall be required by the recorder to labor upon the streets or

public works of the town, the superintendent of streets shall, unless specially instructed by the council, have such labor performed in such place or places, and in such manner, as he may elect.

Section 5. The superintendent of streets shall keep a record of all work and acts done by or under him as such officer, and shall report the same to the council from time to time, or as may be required of him by order of the council.
