## MEMORIAL NO. 71-1

(Asking support for State Legislation for the sharing of federal forest reserve funds by counties and cities)

WHEREAS, Senate Bill No. 319 has been introduced in the 1971 Session of the Oregon Legislative Assembly providing for the distribution of forest reserve funds between cities and counties, and

whereas, heretofore there has existed a gray area in the matter of the relative rights of cities to a use of the forest service monies for the maintenance of its streets as to whether or not the same were county roads within the definitions of the use of federal forest reserve money and the same should be clearly determined and that an equitable and just distribution would be that which has been submitted under the provisions of Senate Bill No. 319, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Hood River:

- 1. That the Senate and the House of Representatives of the State of Oregon are hereby memorialized to take immediate action to establish a definite program for the sharing of the forest service reserve funds between the city and county in line with that set forth by Senate Bill No. 319.
- 2. That the Clerk of the City of Hood River shall send copies of this memorial to the Honorable Kenneth Jernstedt, State Senator and to the Honorable Paul Walden, State Representative at the Oregon Legislative Assembly, and to the League of Oregon Cities.
